



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## Hundred Number Chart

Weather

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After using Saxon Math, I decided to use these calendar pages to keep my students engaged during our math meeting. I use the second 2 pages - copied front to back - for the first 40 lessons. When the Mystery Bag is introduced (Lesson 41) my students use the full page. I place this page in clear plastic sleeves and students use skinny dry erase markers to fill in and interact with all

the calendar components. I have found that students – especially my intervention kids – like having these resources at their fingertips to answer questions and follow along during our math meeting. The only calendar component I did not include is the morning/afternoon clock. The weather graph eventually turns into a temperature graph (Lesson 96) – so we just discuss this during our meeting instead of filling the graph out on paper.
